SUBJECT: Department of Defense Procurement of Ruminant Products from Overseas Origin

This Defense Health Agency Interim Procedures Memorandum (DHA-IPM), based on the authority of References (a), (b), and (c), and in accordance with References (e) through (i), establishes the DHA's procedures to authorize the procurement of all ruminant meat (beef, sheep, goat, bison, etc.) and edible products from ruminants of overseas origin.

This DHA-IPM applies to the DHA Enterprise (components and activities under the authority, direction, and control of the DHA) and the Geographic Combatant Commands, Department of Defense (DoD) Procurement Agencies, and U.S. Army Veterinary Services personnel.

DoD procurement of ruminant meat and meat products will align with current U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service's (APHIS) restrictions and residual risk mitigation measures for bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) in accordance with the most current edition of Reference (i). Overseas procurement of ruminant

meat and meat products by DoD will be limited to source listed in Reference (h) as a negligible or controlled risk for BSE.

Veterinary Service Food Protection Audits will verify the sanitary conditions of the manufacturing plant are equivalent to USDA APHIS sanitary requirements. Personnel from the U.S. Army Veterinary Services will coordinate the inspection systems necessary to ensure required public health lot certification and traceability of subject product at receipt.

The final processor and any subcontractors supplying ruminant meat products to the primary contractor must be audited and listed in Reference (g) in accordance with References (e) and (f).

The proponent of this publication is the Director, DHA Public Health. When Activities are unable to comply with this publication, the activity may request a waiver that must include a justification, to include an analysis of the risk associated with not granting the waiver. The activity director or senior leader will submit the waiver request through their supervisory chain to the Director, DHA Public Health to determine if the waiver may be granted by the Director, DHA or a designee.
