FACT SHEET CCQAS





CCQAS is a health care provider credentialing, privileging, adverse actions, and risk management application mandated by the Military Health System for conducting the provider credentialing and privileging processes. The application streamlines these processes and supports local and contingency operations while assuring the health and safety of all beneficiaries in the MHS.

CCQAS supports the process of obtaining, verifying, and assessing the qualifications of both privileged and non-privileged medical personnel to safely provide patient services. This assessment serves as the basis for clinical privileges and scope of practice decisions. The required information includes qualification data such as relevant education, training, and experience; current licensure; and specialty certification (if applicable) as well as performance data, such as current competency.

The application also tracks health care risk management cases and outcomes, including clinical adverse actions and management of adverse events such as malpractice, and active duty death and disability cases. These actions ensure that the program maintains compliance with regulatory requirements. Additionally, use of ad hoc reporting capabilities facilitate data-driven decision-making and supports Department of Defense accreditation and medical readiness requirements.
