c. Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

The Naval Hospital Guam MedCOI\_Enclave is an enclave architecture consisting of hardware, software, and telecommunications systems. The enclave includes user interfaces such as workstations and laptops and hosts office automation.

PII may be collected, maintained, processed, or disseminated by systems and applications within the enclave or documents stored on file servers and shared drives. Commercial-Off-The-Shelf (COTS) applications such as Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook are utilized to provide administrative support to the enclave and may process PII. PII may include numerous types of PII including employee and beneficiary contact information, military information, demographic information, Social Security Number (SSN), and Protected Health Information (PHI). Commercial-Off-The-Shelf (COTS) applications such as Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook are utilized to provide administrative support to the enclave and may process PII.

PII processed on some system components, applications, and documents might utilize specific administrative, physical, and technical security controls to protect PII confidentiality and which may be addressed in separate privacy impact assessment (PIA)s.
