

DEFENSE HEALTH BOARD MEETING AUGUST 10, 2017

2. OPEN SESSION

a. Administrative & Opening Remarks

Dr. Dickey opened the meeting and welcomed the attendees. CAPT Juliann Althoff called the meeting to order as the Defense Health Board (DHB) Designated Federal Officer. Following a moment of silence to honor Service members, meeting attendees introduced themselves.

b. Joint Staff Surgeon and Combatant Command Surgeons Panel Discussion

Joint Staff Surgeon MG Joseph Caravalho, U.S. Special Operations Command (USSOCOM) Surgeon CAPT Scott Cota and Senior Enlisted Medical Advisor SGM F. Young Bowling, and U.S. Transportation Command (USTRANSCOM) Surgeon Col Paul Friedrichs presented overviews of their roles and responsibilities in support of their operational commands.

- MG Caravalho outlined foundational documents that shape military strategy and Joint operations, including the *Joint Concept for Health Services*, and outlined future challenges, opportunities, and priorities for medical support to the warfighter.
- CAPT Cota described USSOCOM's unique characteristics as a Functional Combatant Command with Title 10 authority and its forward medical capabilities supporting missions in austere environments further challenged by distance. He highlighted the five Special Operations Forces (SOF) truths, noting that most SOF operations require non-SOF support, and highlighted their global medical coordination network.
- Col Friedrichs discussed the history of patient movement and the challenges faced when
 preparing for future conflicts, especially with fewer uniformed personnel to move patients
 and the potential for highly kinetic conflicts with many casualties. He also noted potential
 generators of future casualties, which may include chemical, biological, radiological, and
 nuclear or cyber attacks, among others.
- The group then discussed the benefits of military-to-military or military-to-civilian training and education efforts, as well as future opportunities for collaboration, such as enhancing the National Disaster Medical System.

c. Medical Officer of the U.S. Marine Corps Briefing

RDML Stephen Pachuta, Medical Officer of the U.S. Marine Corps, provided an overview of the U.S. Marine Corps and its fundamental Marine Air Ground Task Force (MAGTF) organization. He explained that Navy Medicine provides all health care provider support to the Marine Corps and that his office, Health Services, is the medical policy arm located in Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps. All MAGTFs have organic medical capabilities, which are scalable to

accommodate the size of the force. RDML Pachuta also discussed the Marine Centered Medical Home model, initiated in 2013 to improve access to care (including embedded mental health). There was robust discussion around this concept, to include the quality of care and the quality of the facilities where care is being provided for this Medical Home model

d. Decision Brief: Pediatric Health Care Services

Dr. George Anderson, Chair of the Health Care Delivery Subcommittee, and Dr. Jeremy Lazarus, Chair of the Neurological/Behavioral Health Subcommittee, out-briefed the *Pediatric Health Care Services* report to the Board for deliberation. This comprehensive report represented the culmination of two years of effort. Board members and members of the public discussed several topics, including that the Joint Outpatient Experience Survey only captures data from patients up to age 10. A representative from the Defense Health Agency Clinical Support Division stated they would provide language to DHB staff to include in the report that clarifies the rationale for this decision. It was also recommended that the report clearly articulate the responsibilities of the Exceptional Family Member Program, as well as clarify Finding 2 to specify more clearly that it is addressing pediatric metrics. After Board deliberation, the report was approved as final.

It was noted that prior to the meeting, the Board received written statements from the public pertinent to this work, which were distributed to the Board members in advance. These included:

- a letter from Autism Spectrum Therapies on the long-term benefits of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA); and
- a letter from Mr. Michael Moran, President of the National Coalition for Access to Autism Services, also describing the long-term benefits of ABA.

3. **NEXT MEETING**

The next DHB meeting is tentatively scheduled for November 2-3, 2017 in Portsmouth, Virginia.


