SUMMARY: This notice provides the updated TRICARE Young Adult program premiums for Calendar Year (CY) 2017.

DATES: The CY 2017 rates contained in this notice are effective for services on or after January 1, 2017.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The final rule published in the *Federal Register* (FR) on May 29, 2013, (78 FR 32116–32121) sets forth rules to implement the TRICARE Young Adult (TYA) program as required by Title 10, United States Code, Section 1110b. Included in the final rule were provisions for updating the TYA premiums for each CY. By law, qualified young adult dependents are charged TYA premiums that represent the full government cost of providing such coverage.

The Defense Health Agency has updated the monthly premiums for CY 2017 as shown below:

UPDATE OF THE TRICARE YOUNG ADULT PROGRAM PREMIUMS

<u>ISSUE</u>: Beginning January 1, 2017, the Defense Health Agency plans to implement the annual update to the TRICARE Young Adult (TYA) program premiums for current and new enrollees. Current enrollees will receive rate notifications well before January 1, 2017.

DISCUSSION:

- TYA is a premium-based health care program that offers extended dependent coverage for
 qualified dependents who do not have TRICARE eligibility at age 21 (age 23 if enrolled in a
 full-time course of study at an approved institution of higher learning, and if the sponsor
 provides at least 50 percent of the financial support) to purchase TRICARE coverage until
 reaching age 26.
- This is similar to extended dependent coverage offered to non-military families by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. The Department of Defense (DoD) will revise the premiums annually at the start of each Calendar Year (CY).
- The law requires the DoD to charge qualified young adult dependents TYA premiums that
 represent the full government cost of providing such coverage. The statute does not allow
 incremental premium increases below the level needed to equal the cost of coverage on an
 appropriate actuarial basis.
- To comply with the statute, the Department reviewed health care costs for this age group during the most recently available and sufficiently complete 24-month period (May 2014 through April 2016) and calculated the full-cost premiums for CY 2017. See below for a summary of the premium changes:
